1. Aims

This policy aims to:

Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for families.

Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010.

Clarify our expectations for school uniform.

2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender

Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils

Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)

Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable

Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons

Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols

Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their families to get in touch with the Headteacher via admin@bowcps.devon.sch.uk, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have to have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for families
-

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible.
- Considering cheaper alternatives to school-branded items, such as logos that can be ironed on, as long as this doesn't compromise quality and durability and plain blue sweaters, without logo.
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveler
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different year/class/house groups
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Considering alternative methods for signaling differences in groups for interschool competitions, such as creating posters or labels
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for families to acquire second-hand uniform items from school
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on families of any changes
- Consulting with families and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

4. Expectations for school uniform

4.1 Our school's uniform

At Bow Community Primary School, pupils are required to wear the following uniform:

- White polo or White shirt/blouse (with or without logo)
- Royal Blue polo (with or without logo)
- Royal Blue Sweatshirt or Cardigan with School logo (plain alternatives are acceptable)
- Black or Grey School trousers
- Black or Grey School Skirt
- Black or Grey School Shorts
- Black or Grey tights
- Black or White Socks
- Black plain low heeled, closed toe school shoes
- Royal Blue and White summer dress

PE Uniform

At Bow Community Primary School, pupils are required to wear the following PE kit:

- Navy Blue hooded Jumper with School logo (plain alternatives are acceptable)

- Royal blue t-shirt or white t-shirt (with or without logo)
- Plain black shorts
- Suitable sports' trainers

Please note, that **makeup, nail polish, false nails** and **jewellery** should not be worn by pupils. Clothing with **Logos** on display are also not in line with our school uniform expectations.

Pupils **should** come into school on days when they have PE in their PE kits. They will not need to change before lessons.

Clothing with Logos on display are also not in line with our school uniform expectations. Children are invited to come into school wearing their PE kits on days when they have PE.

4.2 Purchasing

5. Expectations for our school community

5.1 Pupils

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times (other than specified non-school uniform days) while:

- On the school premises
- Travelling to and from school
- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

Pupils are also expected to contact the Headteacher via admin@bowcps.devon.sch.uk if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.

5.2 Families

Families are expected to make sure their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name
- In good condition

Families are also expected to contact the Headteacher via admin@bowcps.devon.sch.uk if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

Families are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the school uniform in a timely and reasonable manner.

- Disputes about the cost of the school uniform will be:
- Resolved locally
- Dealt with in accordance with our school's complaints policy
- The school will work closely with families to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome.

5.3 Staff

Staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in correct uniform. They will give any pupils and families breaching the uniform policy the opportunity to comply, but will follow up with the Headteacher if the situation doesn't improve.

Ongoing breaches of our uniform policy will be dealt with by the Headteacher.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation.

5.4 Governors

The governing board will review this policy and make sure that it:

- Is appropriate for our school's context
- Is implemented fairly across the school
- Takes into account the views of families and pupils
- Offers a uniform that is appropriate, practical and safe for all pupils

The board will also make sure that the school's uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money, for example by avoiding single supplier contracts and by re-tendering contracts at least every 5 years.

6. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed every 2 years by the headteacher. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
